Note about "God Factors" (401-403): Although students of many different faiths all refer to an entity called "God," it is not always clear just what they have in mind when they use such a term. Accordingly, the project team surveyed the literature in a search for different terms or concepts that people might use in attempting to define what they mean by "God."

Two preliminary lists of terms such as "Creator," "Supreme Being," "Divine Mystery," and "Nature" were included in the 2003 pilot survey. Factor analyses of these terms resulted in a final list of 14 terms that were included in the 2004 freshman and 2007 follow up surveys under the following heading: "Which of the following best characterizes your conception of or experience with God." Students were then instructed to check "all that apply."

A series of 22-variable principal components factor analyses (with Varimax rotation) were then performed using these 14 items as variables together with eight additional items from the survey that made reference to "God" or "Higher Power" (e.g., "Felt loved by God," Reason for praying: "to praise God.").

Three distinct factors emerged from the factor analysis. We named these Personal God, All Powerful God, and Mystical God, respectively. The items making up each of these

Note about "God Factors" (748-750): Although students of many different faiths all refer to an entity called "God," it is not always clear just what they have in mind when they use such a term. Accordingly, the project team surveyed the literature in a search for different terms or concepts that people might use in attempting to define what they mean by "God." Two preliminary lists of terms such as "Creator," "Supreme Being," "Divine Mystery," and "Nature" were included in the 2003 pilot survey. Factor analyses of these terms resulted in a final list of 14 terms that were included in the 2004 freshman and 2007 follow up surveys under the following heading: "Which of the following best characterizes your conception of or experience with God." Students were then instructed to check "all that apply."

A series of 22-variable principal components factor analyses (with Varimax rotation) were then performed using these 14 items as variables together with eight additional items from the survey that made reference to "God" or "Higher Power" (e.g., "Felt loved by God," Reason for praying: "to praise God.").

Three distinct factors emerged from the factor analysis. We named these Personal God, All Powerful God, and Mystical God, respectively. The items making up each of these measures are shown below. There is some tendency for students who embrace a "personal" conception of God also to see God as all powerful (and vice-versa). The mystical conception of God, on the other hand, is only weakly related to the other two.
